- 1. Conducted a survey in school with grades 1-8 on Oct. 28. Top 10 Results are:

- Spoke with two Spanish language schools Spanish Institute and Kids Speak Spanish (a non-profit in Boulder). Both cost about the same approximately \$15/hour class for a 10-class semester starting late January (total \$150 for 1 class per week; \$300 for two classes per week). Minimum 5 students. Cost could be less if there are more students. Adult class also a possibility. If we schedule more than one class the same evening, the price could also be better (for example, Beginner for grades 1-4 followed by Beginner for grades 5-8, followed by Adults). Neither school is sure they can get a teacher to come up here, but as a first step they wanted to know how many students would be interested. Based on the survey, we have 31 in grades 1-4 interested, and 13 in grades 5-8. However, due to the cost, and conflicts with other activities, the actual attendance could be significantly smaller.
- 3. Approached by Jay Link, a member of the community, about running a Robotics class for grades 5-8 to teach basic theory and demonstrate simple computer use and necessary equipment. There will be no charge and he could start right away. 25 students in Grades 5-8 expressed interest in Robotics on survey.
- 4. Strong interest on survey among grades 1-4 for Lego Club. I don't know how a Lego Club is usually run. Maybe we could get community members to lead the group

for a few nights each, and maybe we could get Lego materials donated or purchased by PTSA?
